

SUMMARY OF HRS-LED EFFORTS

Starting in August 2021, HRS activated a multi-pronged action plan to combat the CMS-proposed bundling of cardiac catheter ablation codes for CY22. Action items included partnering with ACC, AMA RUC, and patient advocacy groups while mobilizing HRS members and industry partners for a grassroots campaign to activate hospital system leadership, patients, and congressional representatives.




2 MEETINGS WITH CMS

HRS held 2 meetings directly with CMS to emphasize HRS' opposition and highlight unintended consequences

HRS held 20+ meetings with allies and partners, including ACC, AMA RUC, patient advocacy groups, and industry partners






30,000+ EMAILS

Note: These HRS-led efforts were made in the context of other broad proposed disruptions to the Medicare Physician Fee Schedule for CY 2022. HRS will continue advocacy and education on those matters as well.

The comment submission period closed on September 13, 2021.
